The Executive Chairman of Iberdrola, Ignacio Galán and the President of the Government of Mexico, Andrés Manuel López Obrador met this morning to announce the beginning of a new phase, following the agreement of a memorandum of understanding between <a href="Iberdrola Mexico">Iberdrola Mexico</a> and <a href="Mexico">Mexico</a> Infrastructure Partners ("MIP"), announced earlier today. Both parties have committed to advancing the development of renewable energy in the country.

The operation will have the support of the Government of Mexico through the financial support of the National Infrastructure Fund of Mexico (Fonadin) and other public financial entities.

## Iberdrola, firm commitment to renewable energy development in Mexico

For his part, Ignacio Galán, Executive Chairman of Iberdrola, said that "Iberdrola appreciates the support and flexibility shown by the Government of Mexico to reach this agreement, while considering Mexico a strategic country with potential for growth and expansion where it will show its support to Mexico and the State by developing renewable capacity".
