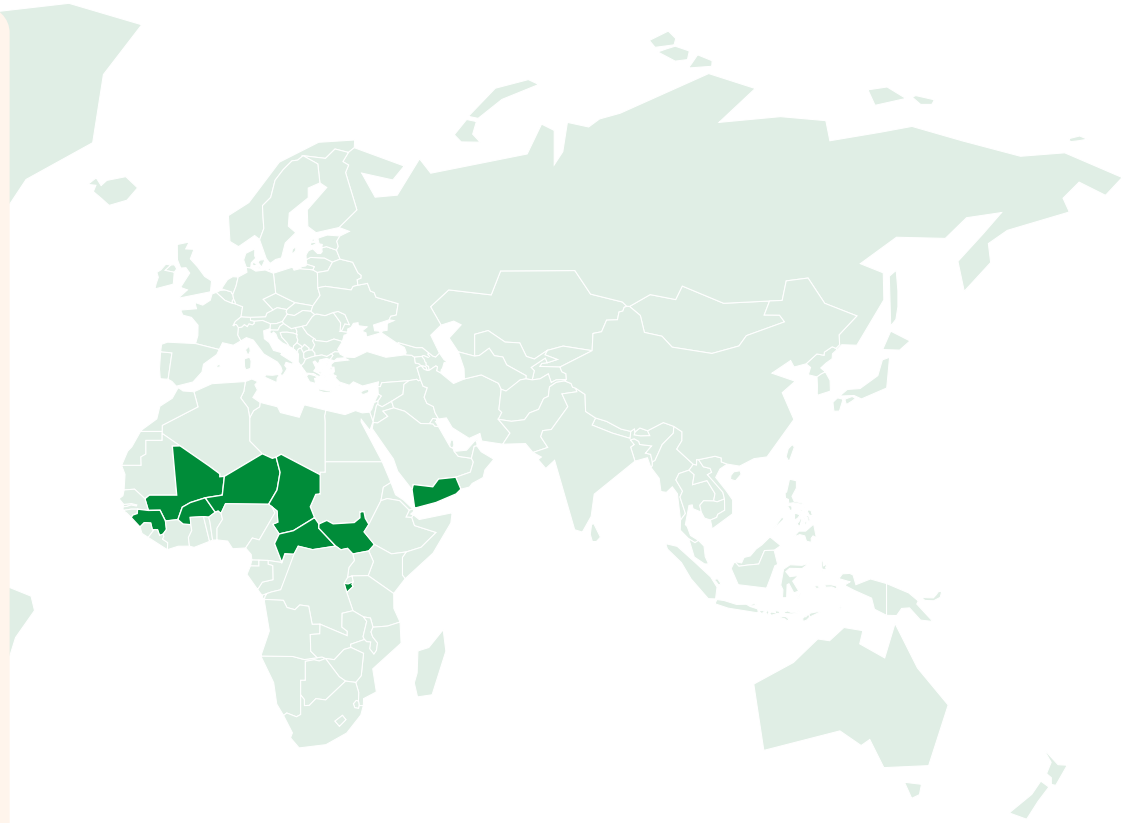

1. Guinea
2. Yemen
3. Burkina Faso
4. Mozambique
5. Mali
6. Burundi
7. Central African Republic
8. Niger
9. Chad
10. South Sudan



Globally, **470** million jobs are needed between **2016** and **2030** for the labour market to keep pace with growth. That would be about 30 million jobs per year.
