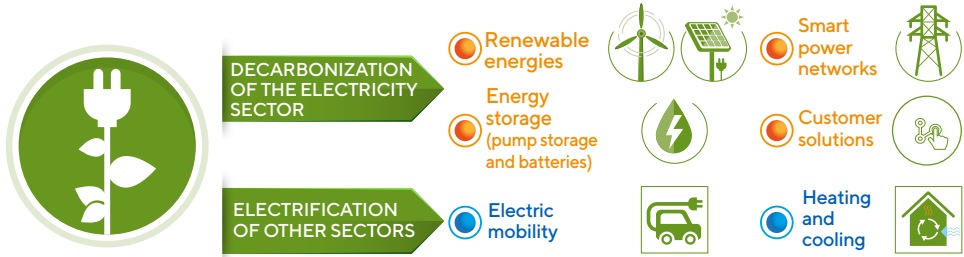


COP 25: Our vision in the fight against climate change

- COP 25: Iberdrola reaffirms its strong commitment to the Paris Agreement, recognizing its key role to move towards emissions reduction pathways aligned with 1.5°C scenarios.
- The transition to a low-carbon economy is feasible, and can be done in an efficient and competitive manner:

- Robust climate policy frameworks will be key to speed up the change: predictability, security and stability to attract investments.

Call to action

The entire society, especially young people, demands governments, policy makers and companies a more active role towards climate action.

We all must move **from WORDS to ACTION**. Denying the problem or delaying the implementation of solutions will only make things worse.

Iberdrola is ahead of the energy transition and, in the context of the COP 25, calls on government leaders to:

- Strengthen Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) in 2020 and present long-term low greenhouse gas emission development strategies fully aligned with a 1.5°C pathway and net zero emissions by 2050.
- Ensure an effective implementation of the “Katowice Rulebook” in the field of transparency, accounting and governance.
- Develop strong guidelines on cooperative approaches – Article 6 – that:
 - Align global cooperation and climate ambition under UNFCCC process.
 - Contribute to create a robust CO₂ price signal, ensuring environmental integrity and tackling competitiveness concerns.
 - Support the design of a robust Sustainable Development Mechanism.



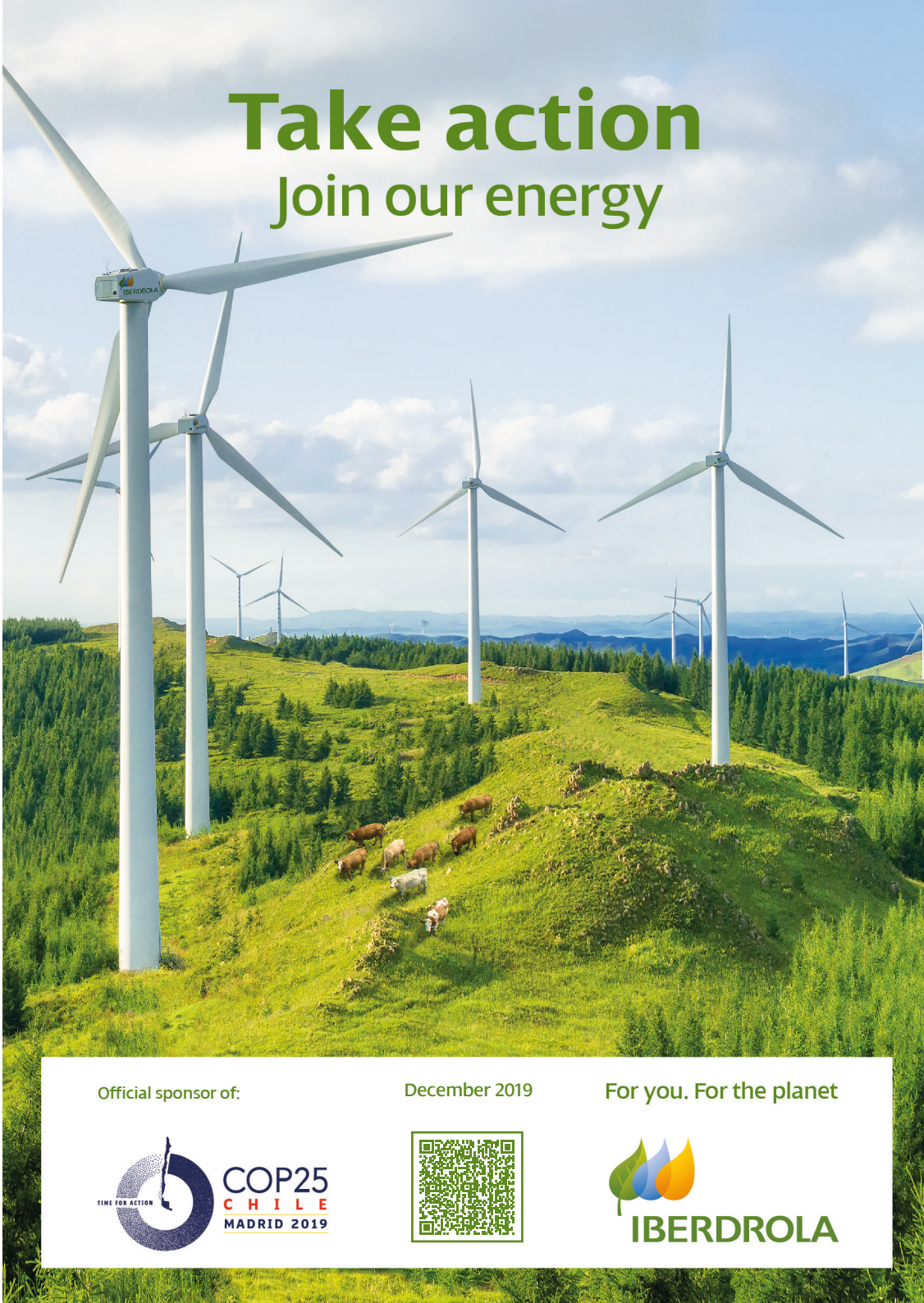

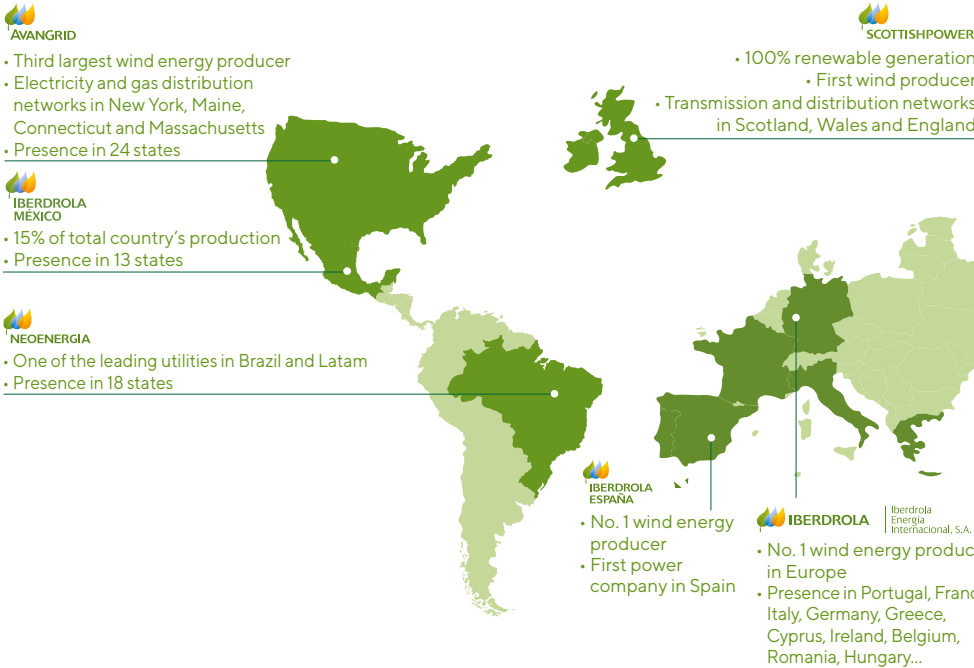
