Iberdrola increases its net profit by 17% and raises its interim dividend by 8.2%

"Thanks to higher investments in the United Kingdom and the United States, Networks have increased their operating result and cash generation, allowing us to improve the year-end forecast to 6,600 million euros, with double-digit growth, and to distribute an interim dividend of 0.25 euros per share, while continuing to strengthen our financial solidity".



Shareholder remuneration

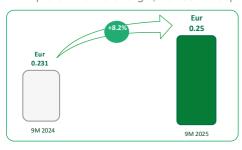
The total shareholder remuneration charged to the 2024 results (paid in 2025) was €0.645 gross per share (+15.6% vs. 2024), broken down as follows:

The interim dividend increases by 8.2%

Last September, the new 2025-2028 strategic plan was presented in London, where the company established a minimum shareholder remuneration of €0.64 per share for the years 2025 to 2028, through its optional dividend system "Iberdrola Flexible Remuneration."

Thanks to the solid performance of the business and improved financial strength, the Board has ap-



proved an **8.2% increase in the interim dividend to €0.25 per share**, which will be paid at the beginning of next year.

As usual, the supplementary dividend will be proposed for approval at the Annual General Shareholders' Meeting and will be paid in July.

The dividend will be paid through the optional dividend system "Iberdrola Flexible Remuneration," allowing shareholders to choose or combine the following alternatives:

- i. Receive their remuneration through the delivery of fully paid-up new shares.
- **ii.** Transfer all or part of their free allocation rights on the market.
- iii. Receive their remuneration in cash through the payment of the Supplementary Dividend.

Highlights of the period

Adjusted EBITDA increased by 4.4% to 12,057 million euros

Adjusted **EBITDA** for the first nine months of 2025 reached 12,057 million euros (although reported EBITDA reached 12,400 million euros due to the sale of smart meters in the United Kingdom), driven by the solid performance of the **Networks** business, which grew by



26% thanks to the increase in the regulated asset base in the United Kingdom and Brazil, as well as positive tariff adjustments in the United States and Brazil.

Meanwhile, the **Renewable Generation and Customers** business maintained solid operating performance, with more than 2,000 MW added in the last twelve months, in a context of lower energy prices and a one-off impact in Iberia related to ancillary services in the Customers business, due to the power outage in Spain. These factors explain the performance for the period, excluding capital gains from asset turnover.

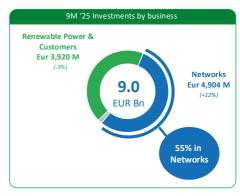
It should be noted that 83% of EBITDA comes from countries with an A credit rating, with a combined contribution from the United Kingdom and the United States (43%), followed by Iberia (35%), Latin America (17%) and other European countries and Australia (5%).

Strong investment growth (+4%)

In line with its growth strategy, the company has allocated 9,000 million euros to investments in the first nine months of 2025, 4% more than in the same period last year. More than 60% of the total investment is concentrated in the United Kingdom and the United States, where the progress of network and renewable energy projects continues to drive business development.

55% of investments are allocated to the **Networks** business, which increased by 12% to 4,904 million euros, bringing the regulated asset base to around 50,000 million euros, driven by growth in Distribution (+25%), mainly in the United Kingdom, the United States, and Brazil.

In **Renewables**, investments reached 3,442 million euros, highlighting the selective commitment to wind technologies, both onshore and offshore, and to the development of strategic projects in the United Kingdom and the United

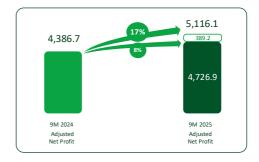


States, which account for 60% of the total. Progress on offshore wind farms under construction in the United Kingdom has led to a 45% increase in investment in the country, strengthening the Group's position in one of its main growth markets.

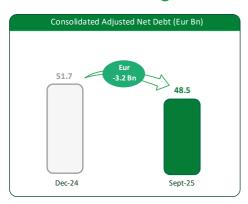


Net profit growth (+17%)

Adjusted net profit stand at 5,116 million euros in the first nine months of 2025, 17% more than in the same period last year. Excluding the recognition of costs in the United States last year, adjusted profit amounted to €4.730 billion, representing growth of 8%.



Financial strength



The increase in cash generation (9,752 million euros) and the execution of our asset rotation and alliance plan, together with the capital increase last July, have enabled us to reduce adjusted net debt by 3,2 million euros so far this year, to 48,5 million euros, which has strengthened financial ratios, despite the acceleration of investments and the consolidation of ENW's debt.

Thus, adjusted net debt to EBITDA is less than 3 times, cash flow to net debt reached 26.2%, and the adjusted leverage ratio is 43.3%, 2 percentage points lower than at the end of 2024.

In addition, we have liquidity of 23,000 million euros.

Monitoring of alliances and asset rotation

Iberdrola has signed asset rotations and alliances worth more than €8 billion in the first nine months of 2025, with a positive impact of 4,5 million euros on net debt.



Agreement with **MASDAR** to co-invest 50% in the East Anglia 3 offshore wind farm (1.4 GW) in the United Kingdom, with an investment of 5,2 million euros.



Accelerated 5,000 million euros capital increase to finance the investment plan for electricity grids in the US and the UK.



Sale of the business in Mexico for 3,7 million euros and divestment in Hungary for €171 million, operations aligned with the portfolio optimization strategy.



Partnership with Echelon Data Centres to develop data centers in Spain and increase in stake in Neoenergia to 84% of the capital, strengthening the Group's presence in Brazil.



New strategic plan 2025-2028

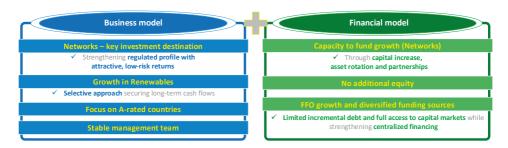
A transformative plan to generate predictable and profitable growth

The new Strategic Plan 2025-2028 drives a transformation of the group's profile towards a more regulated and stable company, with **Networks** as the main growth engine.

The focus is on long-term contracted businesses and the completion of ongoing **renewable energy**

projects, reinforcing predictability, profitability, and security.

In addition, priority is given to countries with an "A" credit rating, such as the United States and the United Kingdom, which offer solid and attractive regulatory frameworks to ensure sustainable and profitable long-term growth.



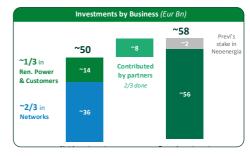
Investment to drive growth

In 2024, global electricity demand increased by 4%, and we expect this trend to continue over the next decade, with a total increase of 50% by 2035 thanks to technological advances and new consumption patterns across all sectors, confirming that electrification is unstoppable.

To support this momentum, gross investments will reach 58,000 million euros during the 2025-2028 period, including nearly 2,000 million euros linked to the agreement with Previ on Neoenergia.

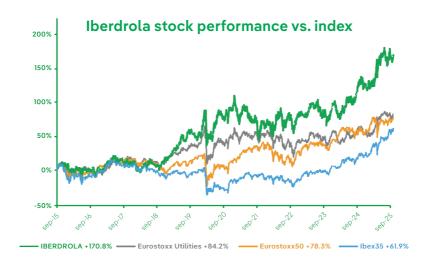
Of this amount, 8,000 million euros will be contributed by strategic partners, resulting in net investments of 50,000 million euros, with two-thirds allocated to Networks and the rest to Renewables and Customers.

By geography, the United Kingdom and the United States will account for 65% of total investment –20 points more than in the previous plan— consolidating their position as the group's main markets. The rest will be distributed between the Iberian Peninsula (15%), Brazil (12%) and other EU countries and Australia (8%).
