Timeline of the European Al Act: key dates and implementation deadlines

9/12/2023



Provisional agreement

The **European Parliament** and the **Council** reach a provisional agreement on the AI Act, establishing the **base text**.

21/5/2024



Formal adoption by the European Council

The step prior to its official entry into force.

12/7/2024



Publication in the Official Journal of the European Union

The regulation is **published** in full, including all its articles.

1/8/2024



European Al Act enters into force

The law officially applies from this day, although it is implemented progressively.

2/2/2025



Certain prohibitions and early obligations begin to be applied

General provisions and the **ban on AI** practices with **unacceptable risk** (prohibited AI practices) come into effect, along with obligations on **AI literacy** (training and awareness).

2/5/2025



Codes of good practice to support correct implementation of the AI Act

The Commission **finalises the codes of good practice** and will adopt the necessary measures, including inviting **suppliers of general-purpose AI models to adhere.**

2/8/2025



Various provisions begin to be applied

Entry into force of the notifying authorities and notified bodies, general-purpose AI models, EU and national governance (designation of competent authorities), the sanctioning regime (except fines for providers of general-purpose AI models), and confidentiality obligations.

2/2/2026



European Commission guidance on high-risk Al systems

The European Commission will provide **practical guidance** on the classification rules for **high-risk AI systems**, along with a comprehensive list of **practical example**s of high-risk and non-high-risk AI use cases.

2/8/2026



General application of the Al Act

The AI Act will **apply in general**, with the **exception** of one **provision relating** to the classification of **high-risk AI systems**.

2/8/2027



Compliance with certain specific obligations related to high-risk Al classification

Application of specific **obligations** related to the **classification of high-risk systems**, particularly for **providers** of general-purpose AI models.

Evaluation and adoption of delegated acts, among others

The Commission will **evaluate** the implementation of the AI Act and the **functioning of the authorities**, and may adopt delegated acts.
