

Iberdrola energizes Alto Paranaíba, the company's largest transmission line in Brazil

- 1,600 kilometres of transmission lines, 3,250 towers and six substations make this project the biggest of its kind developed by Iberdrola in Brazil

Neoenergia, Iberdrola's subsidiary in Brazil, has completed the energization of the last section of the Alto Paranaíba Project, marking the completion of the works of one of the largest electricity transmission initiatives in Brazil. The project significantly increases the power transmission capacity between the north of the state of Minas Gerais and São Paulo.

The Alto Paranaíba lot was awarded to the company in auction 001/2022 of the National Electric Energy Agency (ANEEL) and comprises a large-scale infrastructure: 1,600 kilometers of transmission lines, 3,250 towers and six substations, consolidating itself as the largest project of its kind developed by Neoenergia.

The works were completed more than 15 months ahead of the deadline set by ANEEL and required an investment of close to R\$ 4.2 billion (around €669 million).

According to the company, the last part of this project has been delivered with great satisfaction, with highly qualified teams committed to excellence at every stage. This achievement has reflected the commitment to development and solidity of the Brazilian electricity sector.
