

Iberdrola, the only European electricity company to have featured in every edition of the Dow Jones Best-in-Class World

- *The company has been included for 26 consecutive years, confirming the strength of its strategy and its focus on long-term value creation*

Iberdrola has once again been included in the Dow Jones Best-in-Class World (DJ BIC World) and Dow Jones Best-in-Class Europe (DJ BIC Europe) indices. The electricity company also remains the only European *utility* to have featured in all 26 editions of the global index.

Only 10% of the 2,500 largest companies in the S&P Global BMI universe with the best long-term performance in economic, environmental and social aspects are included in the Dow Jones Best-in-Class World.

The Dow Jones Best-in-Class family of indices, created in 1999, identifies the most advanced companies in sustainability within each sector, based on S&P Global's *Corporate Sustainability Assessment (CSA)*, and includes global, regional and national lists

Iberdrola's continued inclusion in these indices confirms the strength of its strategy and its focus on long-term value creation. The group regularly submits its environmental, social and governance (ESG) performance to assessment by leading international analysts and ranks among the sector's frontrunners in the main rankings.

These accolades received by Iberdrola complement other international sustainability indicators, such as MSCI, CDP Climate Change, Sustainalytics, ISS ESG, FTSE4Good, EcoVadis and S&P Global's *Sustainability Yearbook 2026*.

About Iberdrola

With a market capitalisation exceeding €138 billion, Iberdrola is Europe's largest electricity company and one of the two largest in the world. The Group serves more than 100 million people worldwide and has a workforce of 45,400 employees and assets of €161 billion. In 2025, Iberdrola recorded a record net profit of €6.285 billion. The company contributes around €10.4 billion in tax payments across the countries in which it operates and supports more than 500,000 jobs throughout the supply chain, thanks to €13.2 billion in purchases from tens of thousands of suppliers.

Since 2001, Iberdrola has invested over €175 billion in electricity networks, renewable energy and energy storage to help create an energy model based on electrification. The company operates around 1.4 million km of electricity networks in the United States (the states of New York, Connecticut, Maine and Massachusetts), the United Kingdom (Scotland, England and Wales), Brazil (the states of Bahia, Rio Grande do Norte, Pernambuco, São Paulo and Mato Grosso do Sul, as well as Brasília) and Spain, as well as 58,000 MW of capacity worldwide, of which more than 46,000 MW is renewable.
