Iberdrola invites Bilbao and its visitors to celebrate its 125th anniversary with music and Spain’s largest-ever drone show

Iberdrola invites is inviting the people of Bilbao and visitors to the city to celebrate its 125th anniversary on 12 June with a free music festival and the largest drone show ever staged in Spain, both open to the public.

From 4.00 pm, Doña Casilda Park will host a day dedicated to live music. The line-up features Juanes, Antonio Orozco, Rigoberta Bandini and Süne —four nationally and internationally acclaimed artists whose different musical styles will deliver a diverse programme designed to appeal to all audiences.

The celebrations will continue with an unprecedented drone show: at 11.00 pm, a fleet of 1,500 drones will create illuminated figures and choreographed formations around the Iberdrola Tower in a spectacle visible from multiple points across Bilbao. Powered entirely by renewable energy, the large-scale display will celebrate Iberdrola’s contribution to innovation and sustainability, as well as its commitment to people through a unique shared experience combining technology, music and visual effects.

The event forms part of a broader programme marking the company’s anniversary under the slogan “125 light years”, with initiatives aimed at employees, customers, shareholders and the general public. Highlights include the music festival taking place on 27 June in Madrid, featuring Lenny Kravitz, Manuel Carrasco, Ana Mena and Álvaro de Luna, as well as the concert on 28 November in Valencia featuring Estopa and Mafalda Cardenal.

The programme also includes technology and art exhibitions, social initiatives, and the illumination of iconic buildings and landmarks — activities through which Iberdrola is sharing its history, closely linked to its contribution to development through electrification and its commitment to the communities where it operates.

With a market capitalisation exceeding €138 billion, Iberdrola is the largest electricity company in Europe and one of the two largest worldwide. The Group serves more than 100 million people globally, with a workforce of 45,400 employees and assets totalling €161 billion. In 2025, Iberdrola reported a record net profit of €6.285 billion. The company contributes approximately €10.4 billion in taxes in the countries where it operates and supports more than 500,000 jobs across its supply chain through €13.2 billion in annual procurement from tens of thousands of suppliers.

Since 2001, Iberdrola has invested more than €175 billion in electricity networks, renewable energy and energy storage, contributing to the development of an energy model based on electrification. The company operates approximately 1.4 million kilometres of electricity networks in the United States (New York, Connecticut, Maine and Massachusetts), the United Kingdom (Scotland, England and Wales), Brazil (Bahia, Rio Grande do Norte, Pernambuco, São Paulo, Mato Grosso do Sul and Brasília) and Spain, as well as 58,000 MW of installed capacity worldwide, of which more than 46,000 MW is renewable.
