

It will take place this Friday, 12 June

Top artists and Spain's biggest drone show will mark the celebration of Iberdrola's 125th anniversary in Bilbao

- *Juanes, Antonio Orozco, Rigoberta Bandini and Süne will headline the concerts, between 4 pm and 10 pm, in Doña Casilda Park*
- *Between 11.00 pm and 11.30 pm there will be a display featuring 1,500 drones, which can be viewed from various locations across the city*
- *The event will feature extensive security, transport, public services and cleaning arrangements*

Iberdrola will celebrate its 125th anniversary in Bilbao this Friday, 12 June, with a music festival and a drone show unprecedented in Spain, both free and open to the public.

Between 16:00 and 22:00, Doña Casilda Park will host a major festival featuring performances by Juanes, Antonio Orozco, Rigoberta Bandini and Süne.

Later, between 11.00 pm and 11.30 pm, a unique drone show will take place – the largest ever held in Spain, featuring 1,500 drones – which can be viewed from various locations across Bilbao.

Logistical details: the festival

The festival will begin at 4.00 pm and run until 10.00 pm. The first performance, at around 4.30 pm, will be by Süne, one of the most prominent artists on the contemporary scene in the Basque Country. At 5.35 pm it will be the turn of Rigoberta Bandini, one of the most unique performers on the current scene. Antonio Orozco will take to the stage at around 7.10 pm as one of the most established figures in Spanish pop, and the finale will come at around 8.45 pm with Juanes, an international icon of Latin American music.

To ensure the festival is easily visible, Doña Casilda Park will feature seven screens distributed across different areas. Given the expected large crowds, it is recommended that you arrive at the park early, plan your journey to ensure smooth access, and prioritise the use of public transport.

Logistical details: the drone show

Following the concerts, the grand finale will be a spectacular drone *show*, taking place between 11.00 pm and 11.30 pm with the Iberdrola Tower as a visual landmark. For

around 20 minutes, 1,500 drones will draw luminous 2D and 3D figures in the sky above Bilbao in a large-scale aerial display, choreographed and accompanied by music and visual effects created especially for the occasion. The display, powered by 100% renewable energy, will combine innovation and creativity and can be enjoyed from various points across the city.

Although it will be visible from much of the city, the best places to watch this spectacle include Mount Artxanda, Avenida de las Universidades, the area around the Euskalduna Bridge, Plaza Euskadi and Plaza Txema Aguirre. To this end, at the end of the concerts, the public will be guided in stages towards the designated areas to enjoy the drone air show, via signposted routes that will facilitate movement.

Services available and transport

Throughout the day, the public will have access to information services, areas where food and drink can be purchased, medical assistance, toilets, facilities for people with reduced mobility, a child care area and a Punto Violeta.

In addition, a special cleaning, maintenance and groundskeeping operation will be in place throughout the day, ensuring that the venues are left in optimal condition after the event.

Finally, to ensure the safety and smooth running of the event, special traffic measures will be in place. On Friday itself, from 5.00 pm, pedestrian access to Abandoibarra Park – between the Deusto Bridge, the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao and Mazarredo Avenue – will be restricted, and vehicle access from 7.00 pm, when the Guggenheim and Zubiarte tram stops will also be closed. Traffic will return to normal at midnight, once the show has finished.
