

The initiative would involve €1.8 billion in investment

Iberdrola plans to double the capacity of Whitelee, the UK's largest onshore wind farm

- *Replacing the existing wind turbines with more powerful models would increase the site's capacity from the current 539 megawatts (MW) to 1,000 MW*
 - *Whitelee is already the UK's largest onshore wind farm and one of the three largest in Europe*
 - *The project supports ScottishPower's commitment to strengthening the UK's energy security and independence, while delivering significant economic and social benefits for the local community*
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Iberdrola, through its UK subsidiary ScottishPower, has announced plans to repower Whitelee, the country's largest onshore wind farm, over the coming years.

The initiative, which would involve €1.8 billion in investment, will see the site's existing wind turbines replaced with more modern, higher-capacity models. This would increase the wind farm's capacity from the current 539 megawatts (MW) to 1,000 MW. Once completed, Whitelee will generate enough clean electricity to supply more than 1.5 million people.

The project will also deliver significant economic and employment benefits, generating €380 million in gross value added (GVA) for the Scottish economy over the next decade and supporting hundreds of jobs.

Whitelee is one of Europe's flagship renewable electrification projects. Since entering operation in 2008, the wind farm has supplied clean electricity to millions of homes and has become a strategic asset for the UK electricity system. The repowering project will build on the existing infrastructure to extend the site's operational life and maximise its contribution to the electrification of the economy and decarbonisation.

The project forms part of Iberdrola's long-term commitment to the UK, one of the group's key investment markets. Through ScottishPower, the company plans to invest £28 billion by 2028 to accelerate electrification, primarily through expanding electricity networks and renewable energy, helping to strengthen energy independence, industrial competitiveness and job creation.

The company also has 57,000 MW of installed capacity worldwide, more than 46,000 MW of which is renewable.
